Youth R(e)mote Learning Programs (Y.E.L.P.) 2020

Four limited age groups: Ages 5-7, 8-10 & Ages 11-13 (2 Assistants per 10 - 15 children) Min. 40/ Max. 60

August 25 – October 23 (9 weeks)

Restore Illinois Plan recommended for all sports and childcare policy: Part of **PHASE 4 of Restore Illinois Revitalization Plan** issued on July 29, 2020. Effective date August 15, 2020.

MPD Youth E – Learning Program recognizes the complex new health, safety, and social distancing practices that will need to be implemented. Our modified 2020 summer day camp was a huge success!

A Plan for time sensitive preparations that includes:

- A. How & where to isolate children or staff who become sick
 - What to do if a child or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, including:
- B. Policy for reporting all positive cases to State of Illinois
 1. Plan for reporting incidences of exposure to staff and families while maintaining privacy
 2. Plan for a designated staff person to assist the local health department with contact tracing
 3. Monitoring of absenteeism among children and staff
 4. Plan for working with the local health department to determine the need for facility closure

A Plan that includes preparations for:

- i. A revised operational and preparedness policies in place before program start

- ii. A gradual approach has been developed to present programs in a prudent, safe way that ensures newly restricted procedures to students i.e., a successful 4-week summer day camp was completed
- iii. Completed emergency health form for each participant (keep on file for 90-days)
- iv. Traffic flow signs in hallways and when entering/exiting the facility for all persons
- v. Bring prepacked lunches, snacks, and personal water containers & a change of clothes/towel
- vi. Maintain assigned stabled age groups during activities, bathroom breaks & staggered lunches
- vii. Staff limited to working with one group of children & a “floating” staff member is permitted between no more than 2 groups
- viii. Closed water fountains, no foods shared, and communal containers
- ix. Frequent hand washing, sanitizing hands after each activity
 - a. During outdoor play, face coverings for children and staff are optional when distancing is in place
 - b. Children and staff should change shoes or wipe upon arrival

Drop-offs

1. Curbside drop off, parents cannot enter the building, but must stay until child has been completely screened
2. Assigned staffer will be at door until 9am
3. Perform 2 daily temperature checks – staff, student & visitors with a fever of 100.40 or above must not be admitted
4. Symptom checks - persons who display signs of illness must not enter the facility

Pick-ups

1. Parents will call assigned program cell number to pick up child/ren outside door (708) 375-9910

Daily Program Maintenance Care

Building Maintenance assigned to wipe down rooms' high usage surface areas, and activity equipment after each group uses and at the end of each day

Scenario - Full Day \$125 per week August 25 – October 23, 2020

4 Age groups (1-2) squads each) of ages 5 - 7 & 8 - 10 & 11 - 13 No more than 15 students per 2 assistants per Y.E.L.P. squad **6 - 8-hour days M-F**

-Before care 7am-9am: 2 Staffers maintain screening area

Assistants with their assigned age Y.E.L.P. squad half gym per age group & Room B

-After care 3pm-4pm: 2 Staffers maintain screening area to dismiss students. Assistants with their assigned age Y.E.L.P. squad half gym per age group & Room A

Activity (optional) per district E-Learning instructional time includes 10-minute travel time

9:35am-10:15am- Sport #1

What are Y.E.L.P. hours

9-weeks

Monday August 25 - October 23

7am-4pm Monday -Friday, 9am- 12p & 1p – 3:30p

7am-9am before care, after care 3:30pm-4pm

What will Y.E.L.P. cost & how can I make payments?

Y.E.L.P. fee of \$125.00 per week must be made in advance before the week starts. Payments accepted at Eisenhower Community Center in Hillside, between the hours of 9am-4p Monday – Friday. Cash, credit card or check.

Will students and staff have to be screened?

Yes, persons that enters the building must wear a mask and will be screened. Daily temperatures will be checked, and a questionnaire must be completed. Parents must stay on site outside while child is completely screened before leaving the child behind. Children must bring and wear their mask. They will be permitted to remove their mask throughout the day when social distancing cannot be done e.g., lunch time & periodically during all activities where social distancing is enforced.

What to do if a child or staff becomes ill?

If a student becomes ill the parent will be contacted immediately, while your child will be placed in a designated holding area for pick up. Illinois State procedures and guidelines will be followed before the child or assistant can return.

Food & Beverages?

Vending machines on site for students to use. All students must bring lunch, snack & plastic water bottle Monday through Friday. Water bottles can be refilled throughout the day by a staffer.

Facility Usage?

No public washrooms for outside visitors . Only students & assistants will be permitted to use assigned washrooms. Assigned lockers will be used.

What will activities look like?

All park recreational activities will include social distancing guidelines. Students will move from one station to another 6 feet apart. This will include park recreational activities e.g., skills & drills basketball, football, soccer, dance & cheer.
